

A note from Fr. Abraham

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus at the Temple, 40 days after Christmas.

At the heart of this celebration is the encounter of Simeon and Anna with the Christ Child in the Temple. It is in that holy encounter that Jesus' divinity is manifested by a human prophet for the first time. At His birth, the angels proclaimed His divinity to the shepherds, but in the Temple, Simeon was the first to understand and proclaim Jesus as the Savior of the World. During the Presentation at the Temple, the elderly Simeon, who is the first to recognize Jesus as the light of the world.

"Candlemass" is also a traditional name given to today's feast because as early as the fifth century, the custom of celebrating this feast with lighted candles had developed. The lit candles symbolized Simeon's prophecy that Jesus would be "a light for revelation to the Gentiles."

Come and Join the Candlemass on Monday February 2nd at St. Mary Church at 6:00PM. You are invited to bring your personal candles (such as baptismal candles or home prayer candles) to be blessed.

Let Christ be our Light.

May God continue to bless our parishes, families, friends and the community and may He keep all of us in His loving care.
